These seminars are part of the continuing training of our junior members of chambers and pupils.

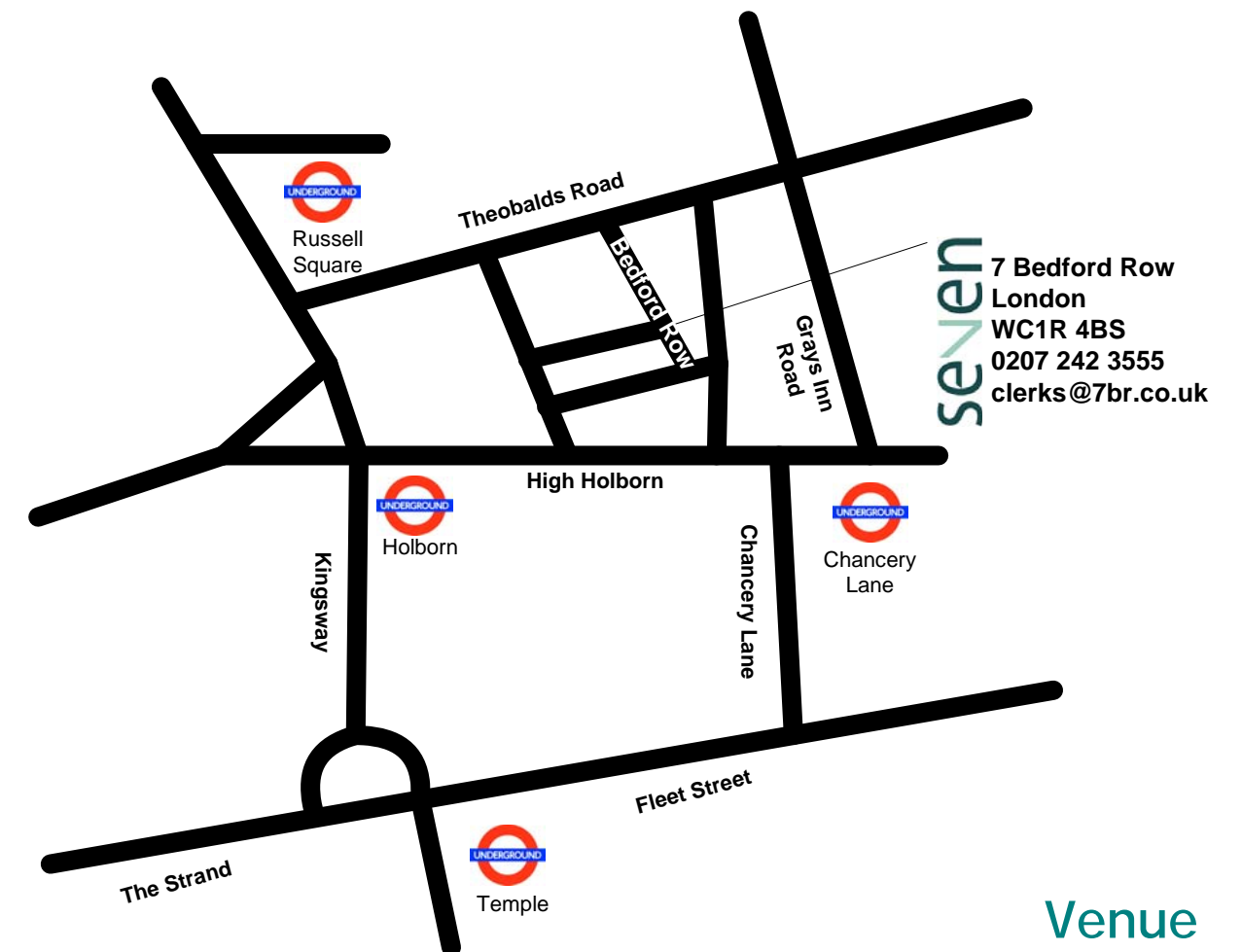
