



Mr Julian Shah MB ChB FRCS
Consultant Urological Surgeon

Biography

Mr Shah qualified in 1972 from Leeds University Medical School and obtained FRCS in 1976. After training in Leeds, Nottingham, Cardiff, Newport, Norwich and London Mr Shah became Consultant Urologist in 1984 at St Peter's Hospitals in London and Senior Lecturer at University College London. He was appointed to the post of Urologist to the Spinal Cord Injuries centre at the Royal National Orthopaedic Hospital in 1985. St Peter's Hospital moved to the Middlesex Hospital in 1992 and then to UCLH in 2005 and has more recently moved to Westmoreland Street to a dedicated Urology Hospital.

Mr Shah is an honorary consultant urological surgeon at the University College Hospital Foundation Trust, Euston Road, London and at the London Spinal Injuries Centre at the Royal National Orthopaedic Hospital, Stanmore. He still acts as a mentor to his younger colleagues at both institutions and continues with some NHS

clinical work. He regularly attends the clinical governance and MDT meetings at UCLH.

His private practice is centred at King Edward VII Hospital in London.

His special interests continue in Urology and are in female and male incontinence, neuro-urology, and the complex reconstructive surgery of the urinary tract. He also has an interest in prostatitis.

He has presented widely at national and international urological conferences and has published numerous papers, chapters and books on urological subjects.

As a popular teacher and mentor, these activities continue.

He has an extensive experience in medico-legal work over the last 20 years. He is currently producing somewhere in the region of 200 medical reports per annum. The balance of the medico-legal practice is 64% claimant, 26% defendant and 10% joint reports.
