Nour trained at a leading international commercial firm, gaining experience in both London and Tokyo. In 2019, Nour was awarded a fellowship by Columbia University Law School to work in Beirut, Lebanon, where she represented protesters in criminal proceedings and worked with victims of the Beirut Port Explosion.
